POLICY

Smoking on Campus

1. Purpose

This policy ensures that Zayed University regulations regarding smoking on campus are in line with UAE government law.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to all Zayed University faculty, staff, and students, as well as campus visitors.

3. Policy

3.1 Zayed University (ZU) is committed to providing a healthy and safe environment for its faculty, staff, students, and guests.

3.2 Students are prohibited from smoking (including electronic cigarettes) anywhere on the ZU campuses and at events sponsored by ZU.

3.3 Smoking (including electronic cigarettes) is prohibited on the ZU campus and grounds for faculty, staff, campus visitors, and guests except in designated smoking areas. Designated smoking areas shall be located where university community members will not be affected by unwanted smoke.

3.4 Smoking is prohibited inside university vehicles.

3.5 Violations may lead to disciplinary measures.
