POLICY

Undergraduate Transfer Admissions and Transfer Credits

1. Purpose

This policy ensures that the processes governing undergraduate transfer admissions to Zayed University ("University"), and transfer credits are in line with government regulations and are conducted with integrity and fairness in a manner that upholds the standards and expectations of the University.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to all undergraduate students who wish to transfer to the University, and to those who wish to transfer credits.

3. Definitions

4. Policy

- **4.1** The University admits national and non-national students who meet the criteria for undergraduate transfer admission.
- **4.2** The admission process will be conducted in a manner that upholds the ethical standards of the University that include professionalism, respect, integrity, fairness, inclusion, and tolerance; and will ensure that no student applying to the University will be discriminated against.
- **4.3** No transfer students will be admitted under the conditions stipulated for conditional admission.
- **4.4** Transfer credits will be assessed on a case-by-case basis according to the criteria stated below.

- **4.5** The number of transfer credits that may be applied to a specific undergraduate degree program must not exceed 50% of the total number of credits that are required to complete the degree.
- **4.6** The University will establish a committee that includes staff from the Admissions team, and subject-matter specialists to evaluate transfer requests, and transfer credits.
 - **4.6.1** The committee will make its recommendations to the Dean, or designee, of the college concerned.
 - **4.6.2** The records of all committee recommendations, including meeting minutes, and the related documents will be maintained by the Admissions team.
- **4.7** The final decisions on transfer admissions and transfer credits rest with the Dean, or designee, of the college concerned.

5. Transfer Admissions

- 5.1 Only students transferring from UAE institutions recorded in the National Register of Licensed Higher Education Institutions, or other organizations in the UAE approved by the Commission for Academic Accreditation, or recognized institutions of higher learning located outside the UAE, are eligible for transfer admission.
- 5.2 Students must meet all the transfer admission requirements of the degree program they wish to transfer to (see appendix).
- **5.3** All entering transfer students must present valid certification demonstrating the required language competency in line with the admission criteria for the degree program they wish to transfer to (see appendix).
- 5.4 Students transferring from other institutions must demonstrate with valid documentation that they are in good academic standing at the institution they are currently attending by meeting the minimum CGPA requirement for the degree program they wish to transfer to (see appendix).
- 5.5 Students must submit official transcripts showing all post-secondary work attempted at all institutions they have attended to the Admissions team at the time of application for transfer admission.
- 5.6 The time spent studying at the previous institution is included in the total amount of time the student spends towards graduation.
 - **5.6.1** Eligible national undergraduate students who receive federal funding will be funded for a time period not exceeding 1.5 times the normal time for the completion of their degree program (e.g., six years for a four-year program). Students who require more time to complete their graduation requirements are responsible for arranging the funding of the remaining tuition fees by themselves (MOE Federal HEI Financing System 2022).

6. Transfer Credits

- 6.1 The University accepts transfer credits in line with the criteria listed below. All transfer credits count towards the completion of degree requirements but are not calculated as part of the Cumulative Grade Point Average.
- **6.2** The University will provide timely written notification to students, prior to admission, of the transferability of credit, how much credit is granted, and how the accepted credit will be applied to the degree program the student wishes to transfer to.
- **6.3** Credits completed more than five (5) years before the intended enrollment date at the University are not transferable.
- 6.4 The University will transfer undergraduate program credits only for courses relevant to the receiving degree that provide equivalent learning outcomes and in which the student earned a grade of C (GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or better.
- **6.5** A University student who has been granted permission by their college to study at another institution during the summer may apply for credit transfer in accordance with university policy.
- **6.6** The University does not grant credit twice for substantially the same course taken at two (2) different institutions.
