POLICY Undergraduate Admission to Zayed University

1. Policy

This policy ensures that the undergraduate admissions process at Zayed University ("**University**") is in line with government regulations and is conducted with integrity and fairness in a manner that upholds the standards and expectations of the University.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to the admission of all undergraduate students.

3. Definitions

National Students	Students who have a U.A.E. passport and U.A.E. National Identity Certificate (U.A.E. Family Book)		
Non-national Students	Students who do not have a U.A.E. passport and/or U.A.E. National Identity Certificate (U.A.E. Family Book)		

4. Policy

- **4.1** The University admits national and non-national students who meet the criteria for undergraduate admission.
- **4.2** The admissions process will be conducted in a manner that upholds the ethical standards of the University that include professionalism, respect, integrity, fairness, inclusion, and tolerance; and will ensure that no student applying to the University will be discriminated against.
- **4.3** The University will publish the admission requirements annually. All admission requirements will be no less rigorous than the requirements stipulated in the Ministry of Education ("**Ministry**") guidelines and must be approved by the University Board of Trustees.
- **4.4** Applicants need to meet the minimum admission requirements for the degree program to which they wish to apply (see the appendix) in order to be considered

for a place at the University.

- **4.5** Admission to the University is competitive. An application for admission does not guarantee the applicant an offer of admission even if the applicant meets all the necessary admission requirements.
- **4.6** The Provost, or designee, retains the authority for final approval of regular undergraduate admissions to the University.

5. Guiding Principles

5.1 Secondary School Completion Requirement

- **5.1.1** Applicants must have completed 12 years of school or submit appropriate written documentation of equivalent education attainment from the Ministry.
- **5.1.2** Applicants need to provide evidence of their secondary school completion in line with the minimum admission requirements of the degree program to which they wish to apply (see the appendix).
- **5.1.3** All secondary school certificates and/or equivalent must be attested by the Ministry.
- **5.1.4** Secondary school graduation certificates obtained more than ten (10) years before the intended enrollment date at the University will not be considered for admission.

5.2 English Language Requirement

Applicants must provide evidence of their English language proficiency in line with the minimum admission requirements of the degree program to which they wish to apply (see the appendix).

5.3 Mathematics Requirement

Applicants must meet the minimum Mathematics score in line with the admission requirements of the degree program to which they wish to apply (see the appendix).

5.4 Other Requirements

Applicants must meet all other requirements in line with the admission requirements of the degree program to which they wish to apply (see the appendix).

6. Students of Determination

Applications from students of determination will be reviewed by the Student Accessibility Services Department. Admission will be granted based on the department's recommendations.

7. Priority Admissions for National Students

7.1 Priority 1

7.1.1 Applicants must have graduated secondary school no more than two (2) semesters prior to the date of their enrollment at the University to be

considered eligible for Priority 1 status.

7.1.2 Priority 1 applicants are eligible to receive federal funding for a maximum time period of 1.5 times the normal period required for the completion of their degree program, e.g., six years for a four-year program (MOE Federal HEI Financing System 2022).

7.2 **Priority 2 and Priority 3**

- 7.2.1 Applicants who have exceeded the one-year limit mentioned in 7.1.1 will be considered either Priority 2 (graduated secondary school between one (1) and three (3) years prior to their admission to the University) or Priority 3 (graduated secondary school more than three (3) years prior to their admission to the University).
- **7.2.2** Admission for Priority 2 and 3 applicants is dependent on the availability of seats in the degree program to which they wish to apply.
- **7.2.3** Priority 2 and 3 applicants may not be eligible to receive federal funding, so they may be required to pay tuition fees at the rate of AED 2500 per credit hour (MOE Federal HEI Financing System 2022).

8. Readmissions and Transfer Admissions

Readmissions and transfer admissions must be managed in accordance with the relevant University policy.

9. Students Seeking a Second Degree

Any student who has graduated from an accredited institution of higher education may apply to take a second degree but not a minor.

- **9.1** Applicants need to provide evidence of their English language proficiency in line with the minimum admission requirements of the degree program to which they wish to apply (see appendix).
- **9.2** Bachelor's degrees earned more than ten (10) years before the intended enrollment date at the University will not be considered for admission.
- **9.3** Admission is dependent on the availability of seats in the degree program to which the applicant wishes to apply.
- 9.4 Students seeking a second degree must pay AED 2500 per credit hour.
