POLICY Approval and Modification of Non-Credit Courses

1. Purpose

This policy outlines the guiding principles for the approval and modification of non-credit courses at Zayed University.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to non-credit courses that are not part of the University degree programs. They are normally offered through Centers or Institutes and are expected to be self-supporting.

- **4.3** Prior to implementation, proposals for new non-credit courses or substantive changes to existing non-credit courses must be reviewed and approved through standard University ("University") procedures.
