POLICY Summer School and Summer Study

1. Purpose

To ensure that the decisions governing the administration of Summer School at Zayed University and the transfer of credits for summer courses taken outside the University are consistent with accepted Zayed University standards.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to all Zayed University Summer School courses, and summer courses taken at other accredited universities by Zayed University undergraduate and graduate students.

4. Summer School at Zayed University

Zayed University ("**University**" or "**ZU**") will regularly offer summer courses to allow students to progress in their academic programs. Summer School will be held in accordance with the dates published in the University Academic Calendar.

4.1 Students

Undergraduate and graduate students at ZU may register for Summer School courses. Details of the conditions for enrollment are stated in the Summer School Procedures.

4.2 Courses

The Dean of each College will propose to the Registrar courses to be taught after considering probable student demand and faculty availability. Details of the conditions for course offerings are stated in the Summer School Procedures. The final decision on which courses are offered rests with the Provost.

4.3 Summer School Director

The Vice-President will appoint a Summer School Director each year, on the recommendation of the Provost. The Director will be selected from a pool of academic administrators and will report to the Provost. The Director will be responsible for the overall management and operation of the Summer School in coordination with the College Deans and the Registrar.

4.4 Faculty

The College Deans are responsible for appointing the faculty who will teach courses during Summer School. Details for the conditions of Summer School faculty appointment are stated in the Procedures.

5. Summer Courses Outside Zayed University

- **5.1** ZU students may take summer courses outside the University after obtaining approval from the student's college officials according to the approval process as outlined in the Procedures of this policy.
- **5.2** Credits earned in courses at other accredited universities that have equivalent courses at ZU for which a grade of C or better has been earned, are transferable as earned credit in line with standard ZU procedures.
- **5.3** The total number of transfer credits and the credits earned from credit-bearing courses taken in Summer School at ZU during the same summer period must not exceed the allowed credit to the student as per the student's Grade Point Average ("GPA").
